

Meeting of the Bombay Town Board

October 8, 2025

Meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Supervisor Jock. Present were Councilmembers Mike Keey, Chad Bryant, and Sarah Devlin. Erin Gray was absent.

- I. **Minutes** – Mike motions to accept the minutes as read by the clerk, seconded by Sarah. All voted “Aye”, motion carried.
- II. **Data Collection** – Angela Lucey from Tupper Lake presented information about her work experience and answered questions about collecting data on parcels in Bombay. Chris will speak with Vern (Assessor) about meeting with her before the Board moves forward.
- III. **Budget** – Chris is continuing to work on the budget to stay within the 2% cap.
- IV. **FEMA** – Progress with finalizing projects continues.
- V. **Highway Excavator** – 4 quotes were obtained for a wheeled excavator. Kleiss Equipment in Constantia - Develon Mini wheel DX100W-7 \$206,218.00, Tracey Road Equipment Inc in Syracuse – 2013 Liebherr A904C Litronic \$179,000, Anderson Equipment Co in Rochester – 2025 Takeuchi TB395W \$210,840 & 2022 Mecala-9MWR \$203,490. Mike and Chad will examine the specifications and warranties closer before a decision is made.
- VI. **Railroad Crossings** – Mike Kelley reports that CSX has changed the date for remediating the crossings in Bombay until Spring 2026.
- VII. **Auction property** – The foreclosed property next to the Fire Department has become available. The expected price is \$6100; the Fire Dept. has allocated \$5000. Mike motions to pay the cost above \$5000 and to provide the labor and equipment necessary to clean the site. Motion is seconded by Sarah. All voted “Aye”, motion carried.
- VIII. **Highway Inventory** – Inventory has been started at the Town Garage.
- IX. **Executive Session** – Sarah motions to enter executive session at 6:55 p.m. to discuss ongoing litigation, seconded by Chad. All voted “Aye”, motion carried. Session was closed at 7:05 p.m.
